This Gratitude Season we have been encouraged to consider all that we are in Christ, all that we have, and all that we can give. This led me to stop and literally count blessings at Peace. People often are curious about Peace by the numbers. I bet you will rejoice with me in all these blessings: We have close to 300 people who are active in some way with Peace. Of those, 200 are members or affiliates, or ordained Ministers active in the congregation (12 of them). We have 20 young adults (18-25), 20 youth in middle and high school, and 12 children. We have three sand hill cranes, four deer, and two hawks, who call Peace home.

We have eleven ministry teams plus a membership task force, and a Stephen Ministry group. We have five choirs and Gia is always wanting

more. We have more than ten small groups and this number is always growing; these are task groups, exercise groups, prayer/Bible groups, sharing groups, dinner groups. We have five goals: Inspiring Worship, Authentic Relationships,

Nurturing Discipleship, Compassionate Outreach, and Responsive Stewardship.

We support with money, energy, and time Beth-El Farmworker Ministries and about 16 other missions beyond Peace Church. We are giving away about 16% of our budget to these benevolences. In 2016, we have already volunteered 1600 hours at Beth-El to help feed, clothe, educate, and support local farmworkers and their families.

We've worshipped weekly in four different locations over the last decade. We have done a

preliminary design on three different sanctuaries on two sites the last five years and the third design is definitely the charm! We've raised over a million dollars twice in building campaigns—the first to buy this property and the second to build the 360-seat sanctuary, whose detailed design is coming together for ground-breaking in spring of 2017.



In our current building, we have a chapel (future fellowship hall) and a café, five offices, two music rooms, five adult classrooms, four children's rooms, four youth rooms, nine restrooms, and too many closets and storage rooms to count. We have three refrigerators and two kitchens—one kitchen for cooking and the other for cleaning. If you don't understand that last line, take a tour or wash some coffee cups with the Fellowship Team.

God has blessed us. It is fun to count our blessings, give thanks, and be satisfied with the bountiful gifts of our God. Most of all, I like to count my people-blessings and each of you is one!

## Shannon Jung is new Parish Associate

Recently there was an addition to the staff at Peace Presbyterian. Shannon Jung has become the Parish Associate. This column introduces him.

Shannon and his wife, Patti retired to Bradenton in 2014 after careers in teaching. It was the first time they had selected a place to live based on geography rather than the location of their employers. They tested the waters in February, March, and April 2014 and found the Suncoast perfect for them. The friendly welcome by people at Peace was one of the attractions.

Shannon has been called as a part-time (15 hours a week), temporary pastor. His responsibilities are to serve as a resource person on ministry teams, especially Outreach, Mission, and Adult Ed, to do pastoral ministry, and to lead worship once a month or so. The committee which is seeking to find a Director or Pastor for Ministry to Children, Youth, and Families is still active and, when it finds the right person, the position of Parish Associate will evaporate and Shannon will return to the church as a congregant.

As a professor, Shannon led two small rural churches part-time and loved that work. He has had the dream upon retirement of working as an interim or pulpit supply pastor

in a smaller church. That dream has been fulfilled at Peace (except for the part about smaller membership!).

Peace is growing and, in the transition from a pastor-sized church (50-150 in worship) to a program-size church (150-350), needed to find some additional staff. Shannon's gifts, experience, and flexibility fit the nature of our need.

He is an ordained minister of the PCUSA and served churches in Tennessee and Minnesota as well as moderated Sessions in other presbyteries. A professor at Concordia College (MN), Dubuque and Wartburg seminaries in Iowa, and also at the Saint Paul School of Theology, Kansas City, he has seen teaching as his vocation. His research areas have been the theology of eating and

leading the smaller membership, rural church. He thinks about how the country and the church can assist lower-income peoples to live a more satisfying life.

Patti and Shannon have been married for 42 years and have three sons, two daughters-in-law, one engaged daughter-in-law-to-be, six grandchildren, and a dog. They live in Bradenton and enjoy the beach, kayaking, and walking.

They love being at Peace.

## Turning Points in Bradenton

An exciting possibility for mission involvement is Turning Point in Bradenton.

This is an agency that offers any number of services -- from job counseling, haircuts, intake, filling out food stamp applications, medical and dental services, laundry, showers, and computer banks.

Turning Points now has openings for volunteers in the following areas: food stamps, intake, coordinator for volunteer recognition dinner in March, and medical personnel.

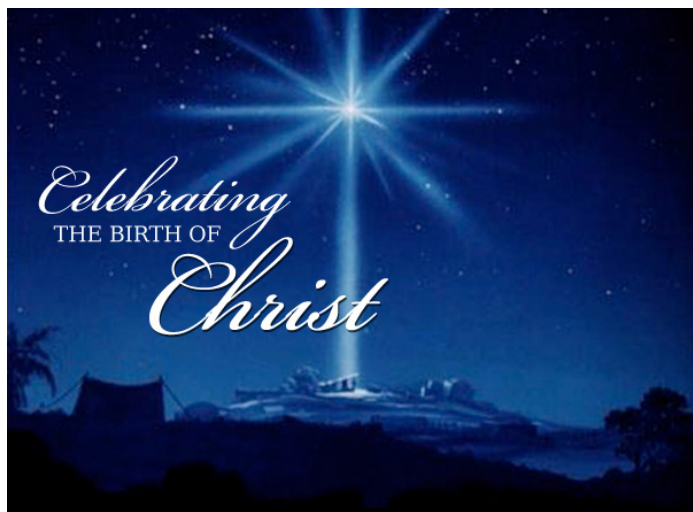

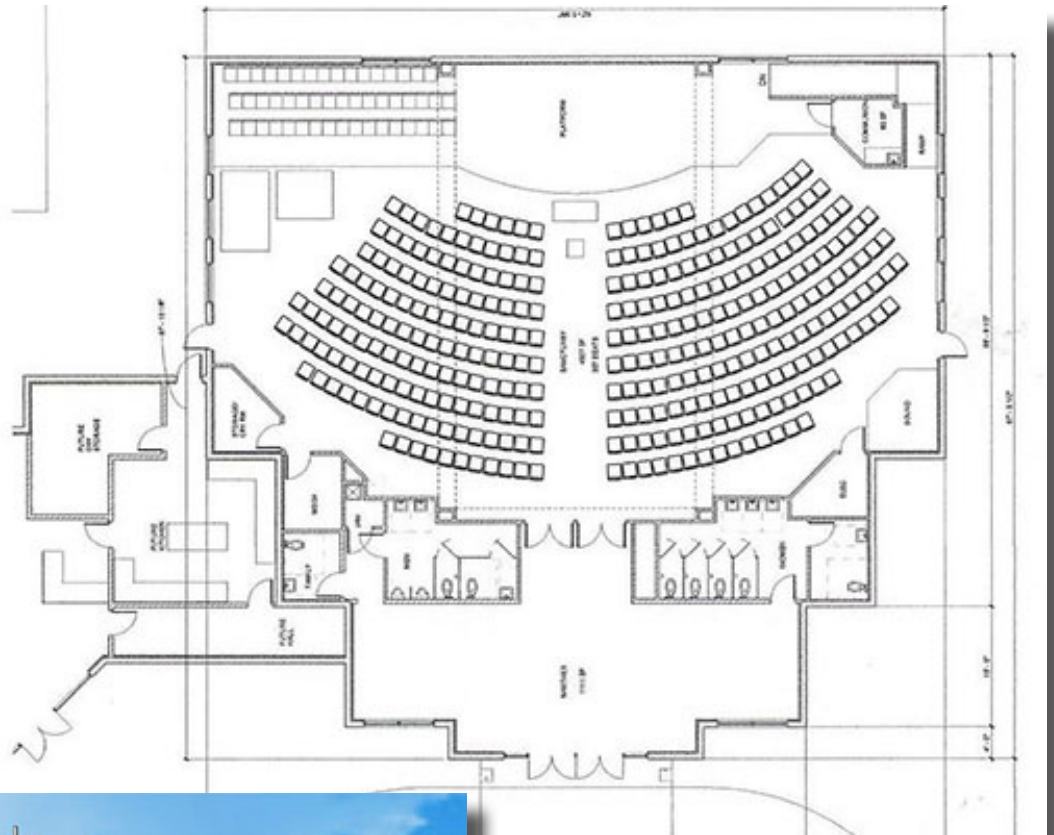

## Blood Drive a Success!

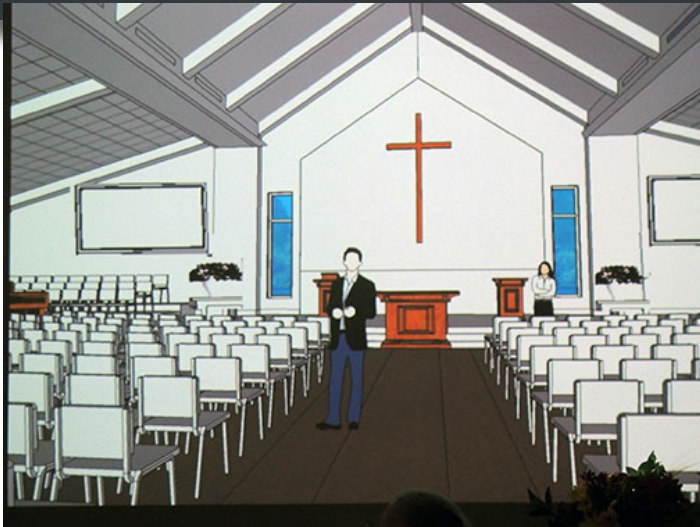

## **Building Peace Church**

The Building Vision Team presented drawings of the proposed sanctuary to the congregation at the Gratitude Dinner. There are copies available at the church if you were not able to attend. The new floor plan has seating for 360 people and is 7,216 square feet. A drawing of the proposed front of the sanctuary and a depiction of what the inside will look like are shown above. The loan and pledges for the sanctuary itself are secured, but an additional \$130,000 will be needed to finish a portico and walkway from the current building to the sanctuary. The plan is to break ground east of the current building in March, 2017.

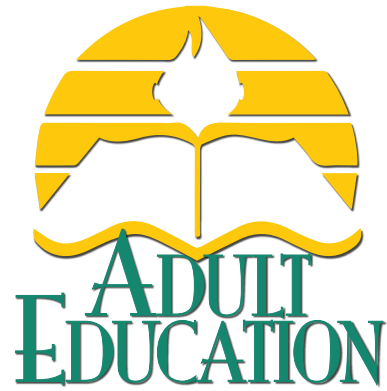


## Satisfied

## Presbyterian Alternative Gift Giving

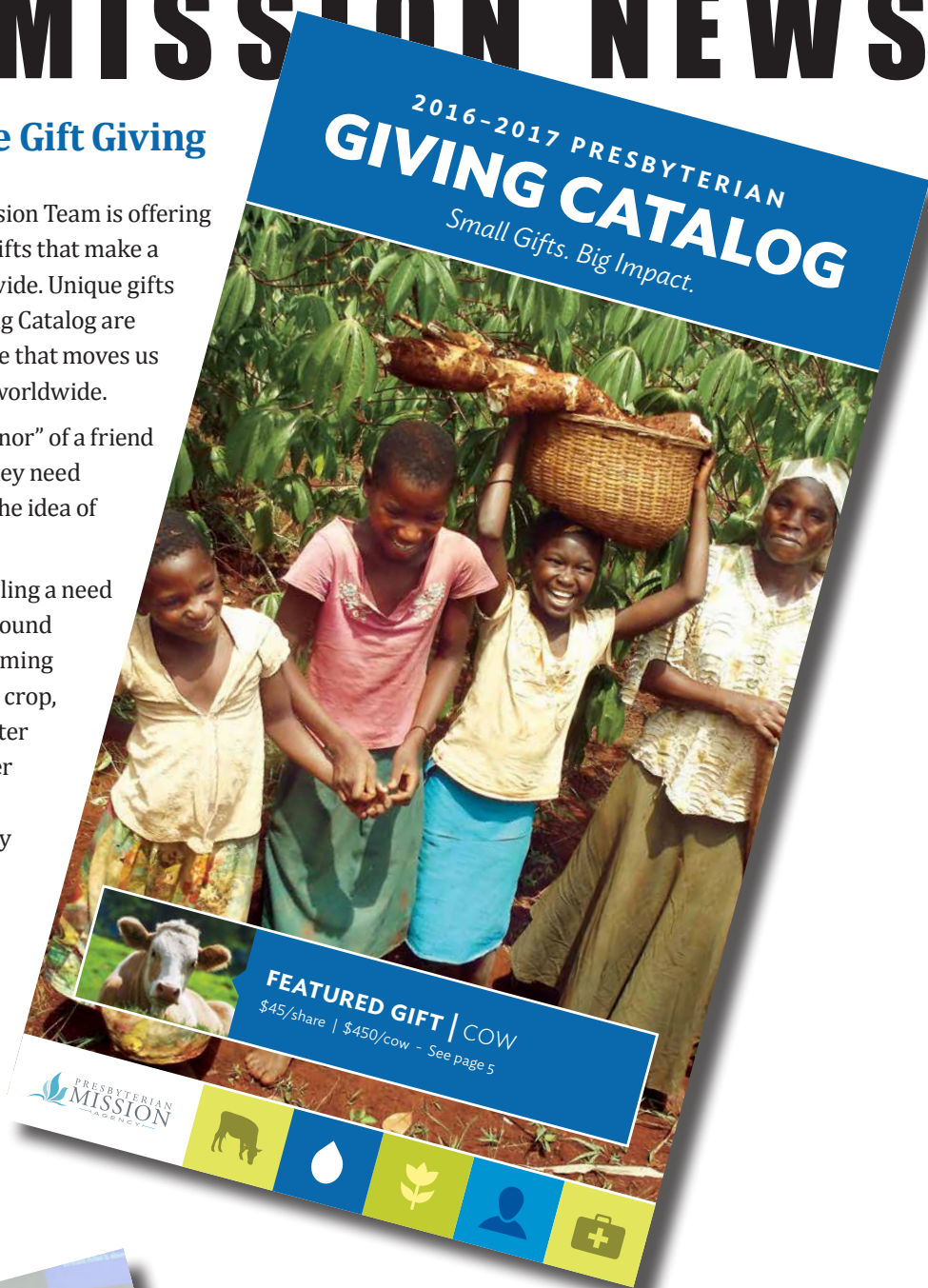
