A Presbyterian minister who never served a particular congregation nurtured the faith of many congregations as his words were often quoted in sermons. Frederick Buechner died this month at the age of 96, having written books on many subjects, always encouraging his readers, "Listen to your life.

See it for the fathomless mystery it is. In the boredom and pain of it, no less than in the excitement and gladness: touch, taste, smell your way to the holy and hidden heart of it, because in the last analysis all moments are key moments, and life itself is grace."

I challenge you to engage more actively in Peace's life this autumn, as you are able, because I firmly believe that what we are doing together in Christian community is a small but valuable part of making this world more loving, more just, more peaceful. There are plenty of activities competing for your attention, but your church life plays a crucial role in centering you in the things that matter most.

As the beloved writer said, "We must be careful with our lives, for Christ's sake, because it would seem that they are the only lives we are going to have in this puzzling and perilous world, and so they are very precious and what we do with them matters enormously."



So stop for a moment and ponder how you are spending your time. Are you following the call of God? As Buechner said, "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

Fredrick Buechner, 1926-2022

Carl Frederick Buechner was an American writer, novelist, poet, autobiographer, essayist, preacher, and theologian. He was an ordained Presbyterian minister and the author of thirty-nine published books. His work encompassed different genres, including fiction, autobiography, essays and sermons, and his career spanned more than six decades. Buechner's books were translated into many languages for publication around the world. He was best known for his novels, including *A Long Day's Dying, The Book of Bebb, Godric* (a finalist for the 1981 Pulitzer Prize), and *Brendan*, his memoirs, including *Telling Secrets* and *The Sacred Journey*, and his more theological works, including *Secrets in the Dark, The Magnificent Defeat*, and *Telling the Truth*.






In addition to the constant regular repairs, maintenance and gardening that is part of life on the Property Team, we have several exciting bigger projects either recently completed or in-progress.

leading many Christians to focus more on the dangers we wish to avoid than the goods we wish to pursue.



Do you have a deep longing for something more? It may be something you can't explain, but you have moral yearnings and visionary dreams that nothing has satisfied.




October—Dakin Dairy Tour and Hayride and ice cream, 90 minutes, \$10
